RULES FOR EXHIBITORS - please read carefully

- 1 Intending exhibitors should complete and return the official Entry Form no later than **Thursday 18th August.**
- 2 All exhibitors to bring entries to Village Hall on Saturday 20th August between 8-10.30 am.
- 3 All those wishing to retain their entries must clear them from the Hall BETWEEN 5-5.30 pm on the day of the show. Produce left after this hour will be sold for the benefit of the Society. **NO ARTICLE MAY BE REMOVED BEFORE THIS HOUR.**
- 4 All entries must be grown or made by the competitor with the exception of Division D. (Not applicable to Class 60)
- 5 No competitor may enter more than one exhibit in any single class.
- 6 Divisions A, B, D, E, F, are open to all competitors unconditionally.
- 7 Division C is open only to those who have not won a Cup in a previous show in Ashington.
- 8 Divisions G and H are open to children up to 16 and will be judged in two age groups – up to 7 years and 8 years and above.

SPECIAL AWARDS

- 1 The Banksian Medal; Awarded to the winner of the largest total of prize money in the Horticultural Classes, it cannot be won again for three years.
- 2 The Champion Challenge Cup. Donated by the late Mr A.G. Linfield will be awarded to the Competitor gaining the highest prize money in Divisions A and B
- 3 The Ina Houghton Challenge Cup. Awarded to the competitor who is runner-up in Divisions A & B.
- 4 The Willard Challenge Cup will be awarded to the Competitor gaining the highest prize money in Division C subject to the prizes being a minimum of £1.50 in the Division
- 5 The Holmden Cup will be awarded to the competitor gaining the highest prize money in Division B
- 6 The Rowland Cup. Will be awarded to the best exhibit in Division D
- 7 A Challenge Cup, presented by Mr J Stoner will be awarded to the competitor gaining the highest prize money in Division E
- 8 The Copeland Cup will be awarded to the competitors gaining the highest prize money in Division F
- 9 A Challenge Cup, donated by the late Mrs J Harris will be awarded to the boy or girl gaining the highest prize money in Division G
- 10 The Enid Foster Cup for the highest prize money in Division D
- 11 The George James Cup awarded to Best Exhibit in Class A
- 12 The Chanctonbury Nurseries Cup for the person gaining the highest number of points in the show.
- 13 The Junior Gardener Cup + £10 voucher, presented by Mr C. Williamson will be awarded for the competitor with the highest points in Division H.

No competitor will be awarded the same Cup for two years in succession, with the exception of the Holmden Cup, Rowland and George James Cup, which is for individual entries.
